Earning a High School Diploma

 - ► If the course requires an EOC, you must take the EOC which counts 20% of your grade.
 - (% weight is subject to change depending on COVID).
 - ► To earn credit for a class, you must PASS the class (70+).
 - If you fail a required course, you must take it again.

Work-Based Learning (WBL)

- Work release program available to juniors and seniors only.
 Priority is given to seniors.
- Students must have a job or internship and work a minimum of 16 hours per week.
- Students must complete at least one CTAE pathway to be eligible for WBL.
- May register for 1 or 2 blocks each semester.
- RHS is limited to 90 participants in WBL.
- Priority is given to CTAE Pathway completers and Seniors.

Physical Education

 Health and Personal Fitness - 1 credit required by Georgia for graduation

 Weight Training - physically rigorous course, recommended for student athletes - Several head coaches (baseball, football) expect their student athletes to be in weight training.

*Only one PE course per semester. Graduation requirements supersede weight training/team sports - EVERY TIME
